County Seat: Mansfield City

Richland county had a population of 128,852 in 2000, and is expected to decrease to 121,200 by 2015. From 98-99, net migration numbers revealed that more people moved out of the county than moved in. In 1999, the personal income per capita reached \$22,721, while the state of Ohio averaged \$27,171.

1998 poverty numbers show an overall rate of 11% for the county and 10.7% across Ohio for all persons.

In 1999 more persons were employed in the Manufacturing industry, the largest payroll came from the Manufacturing sector, and the Retail trade industry had the largest number of establishments.* In 1998 Richland county had a net increase in the number of businesses started.

In 1997 crop cash receipts totaled \$37,857,000, while livestock cash receipts totaled \$26,183,000. In 1997 an average of 171 acres per farm combined for 908 farms across a total of 155,516 acres in farm use. In 1997 soybeans generated the largest amount of crop cash receipts while dairy produced the largest amount of livestock cash receipts.

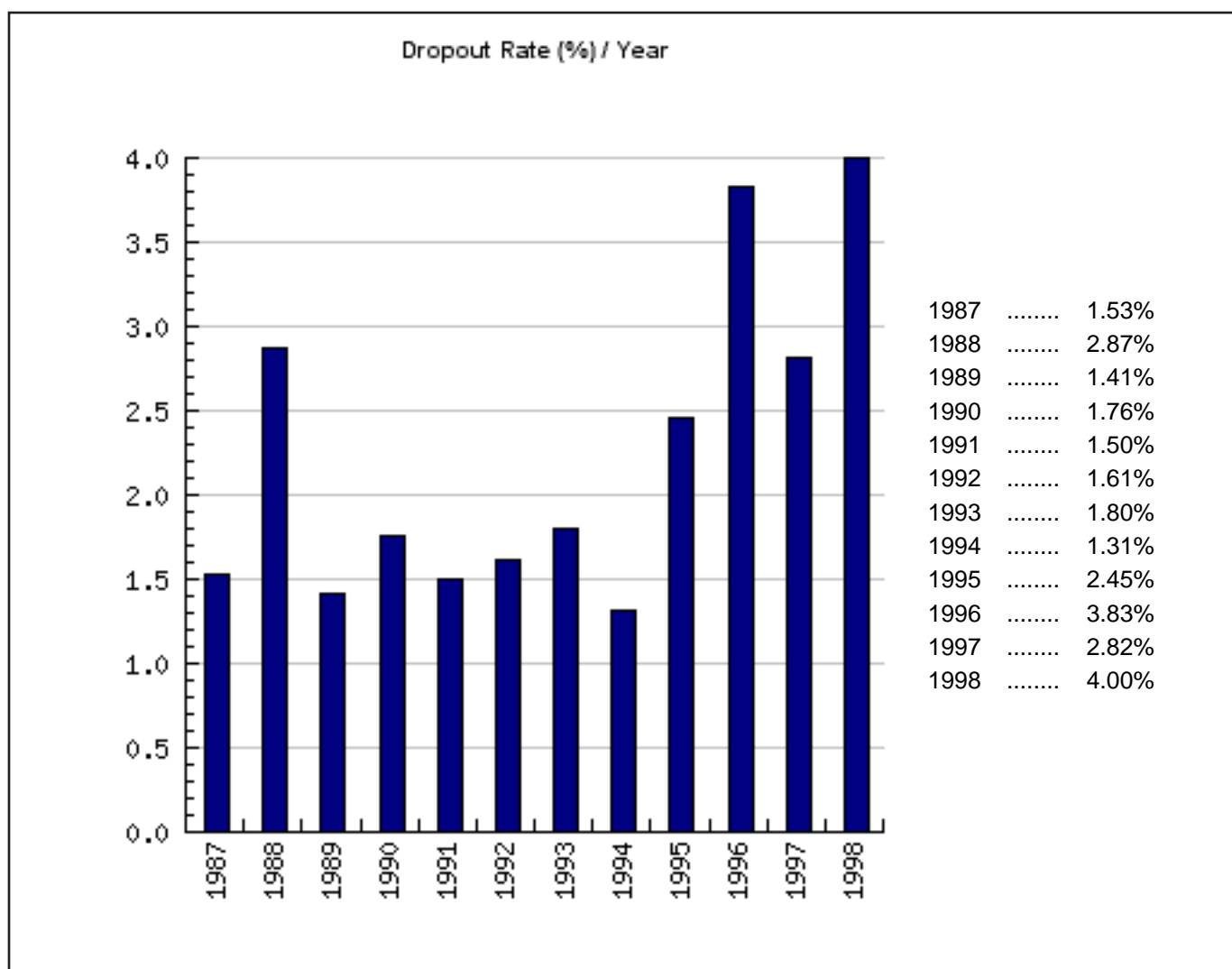

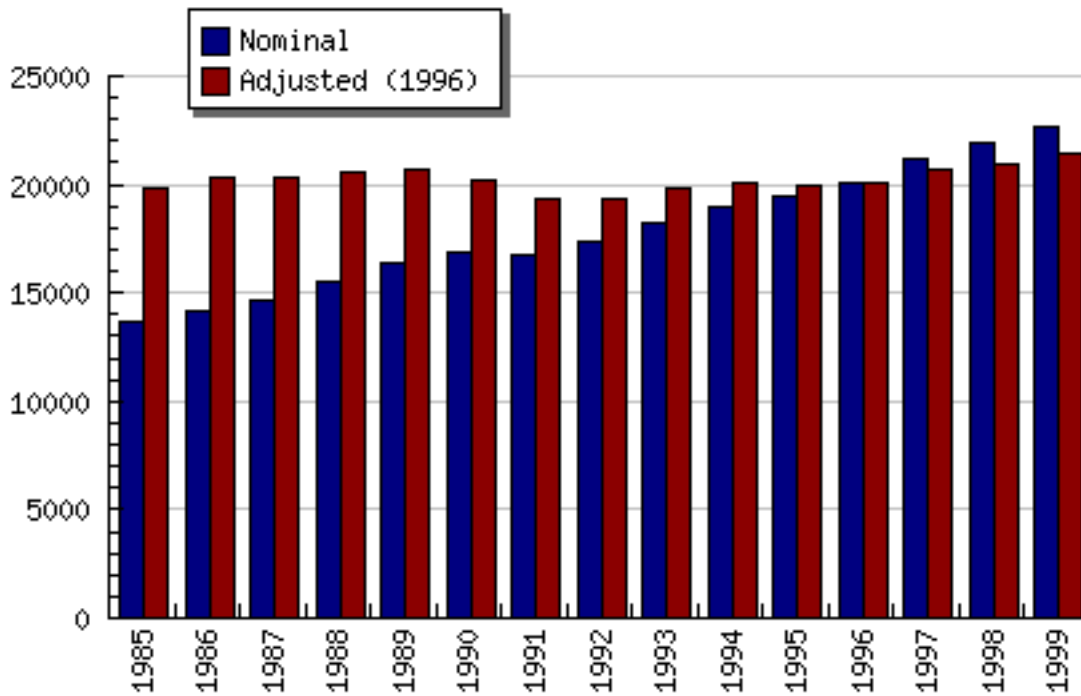

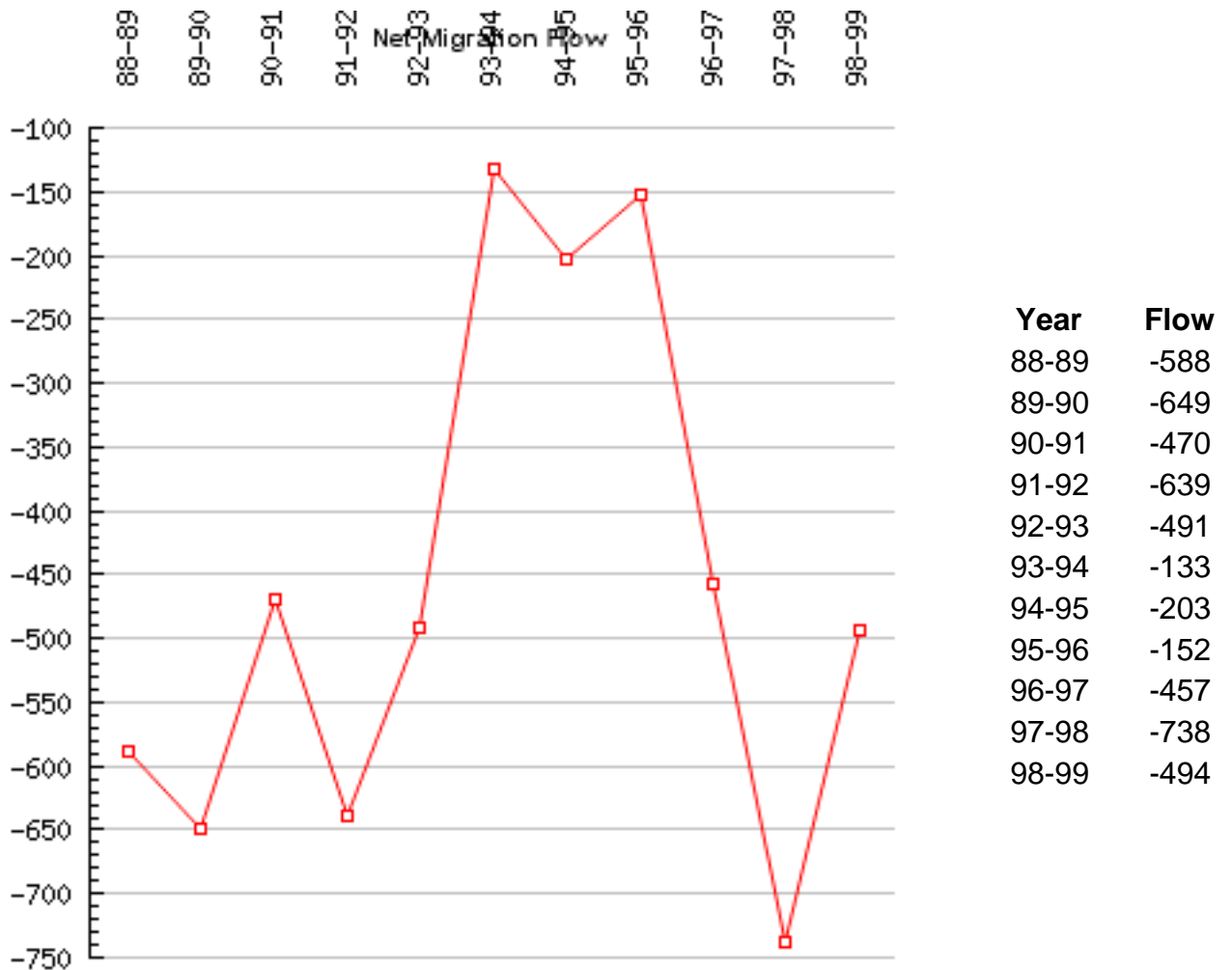

Richland County - Net Migration



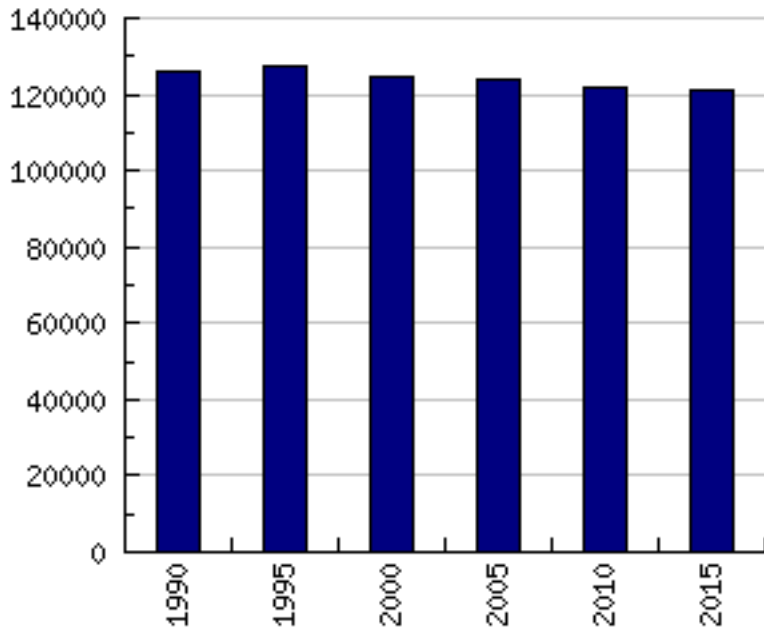

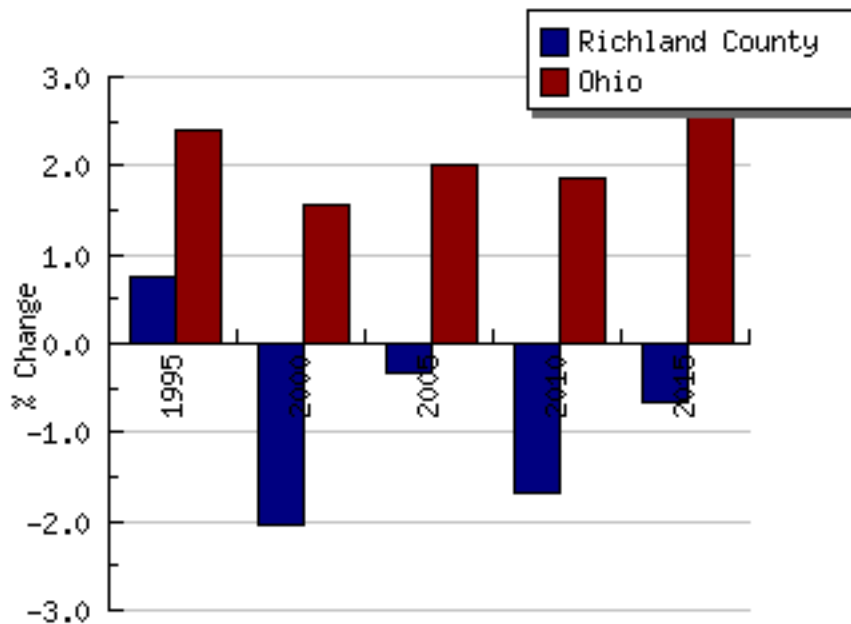

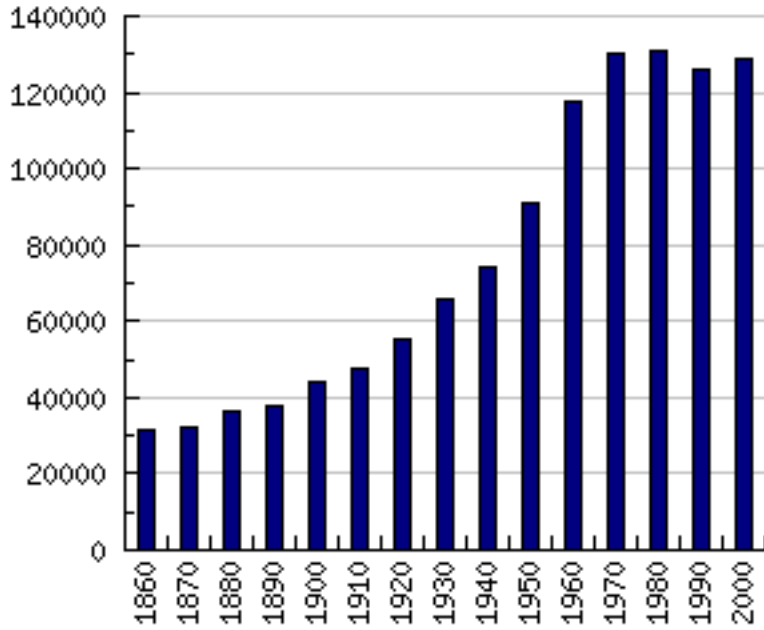

Population Change Projections



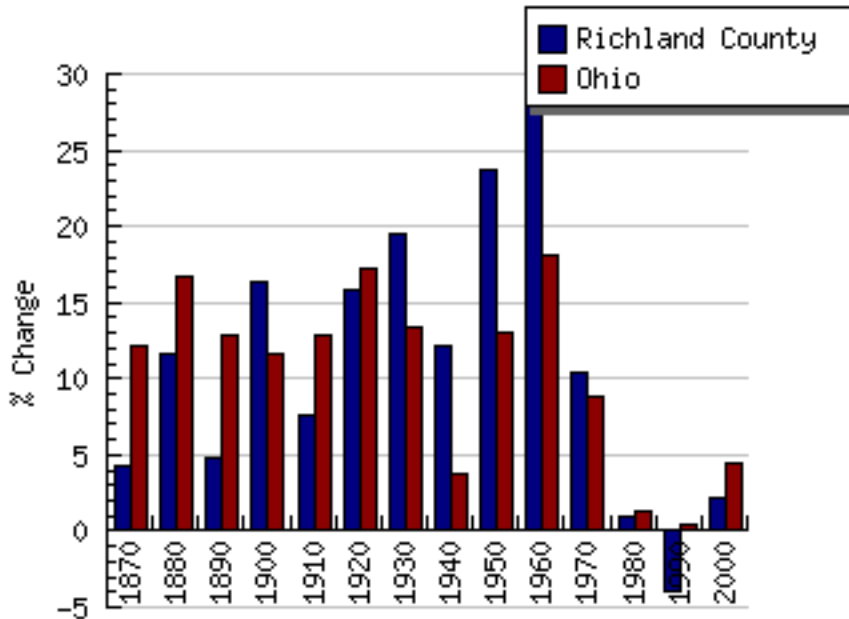

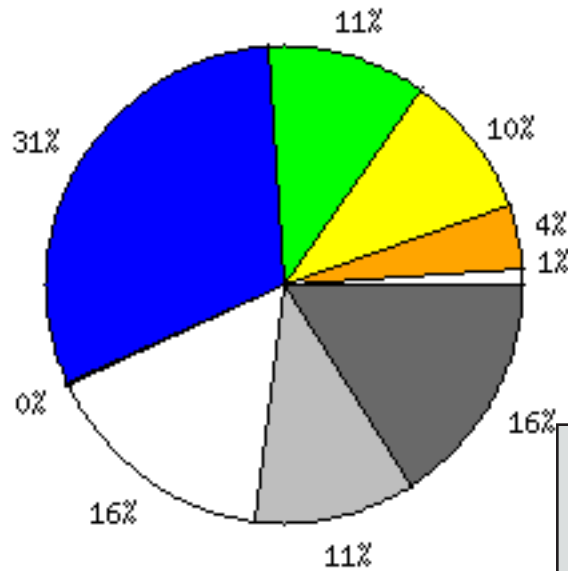

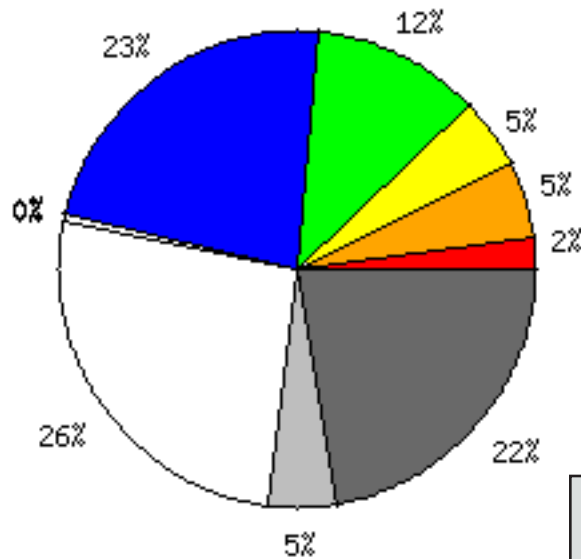
1998 Value Added By Sector

Employment includes full-time and part-time workers and the self-employed in all sectors, including agriculture.

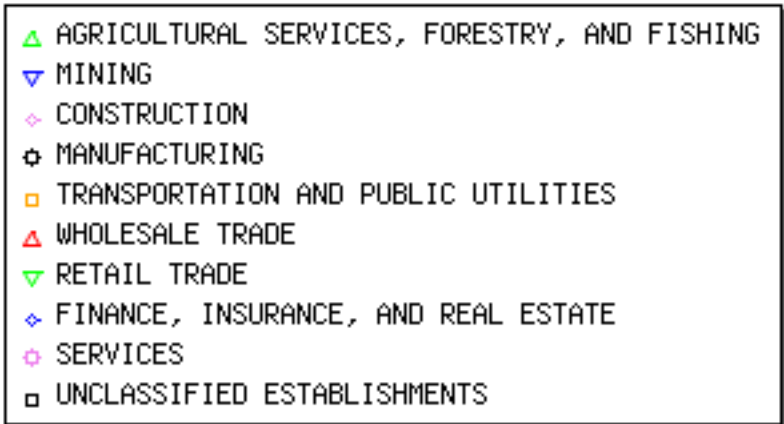
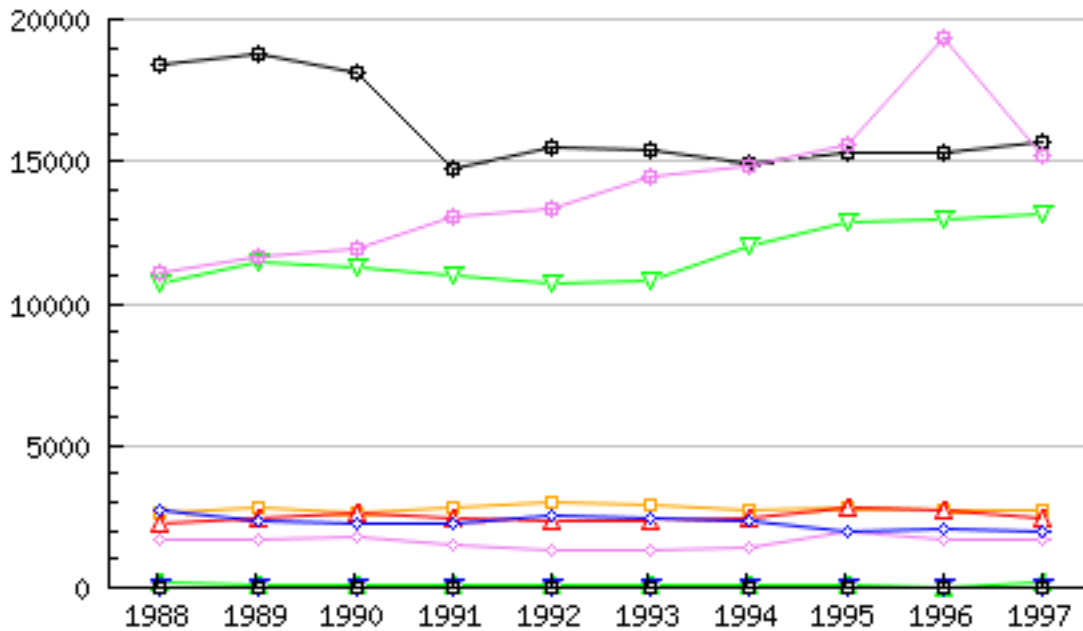

Total number of Mid-March Employees

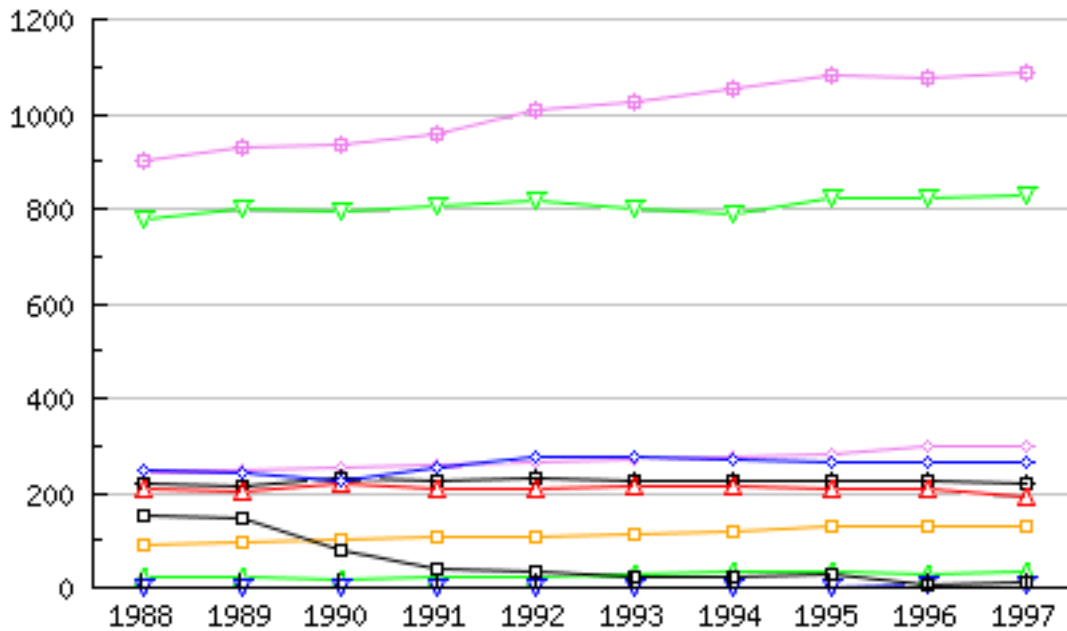

Total Number of Establishments



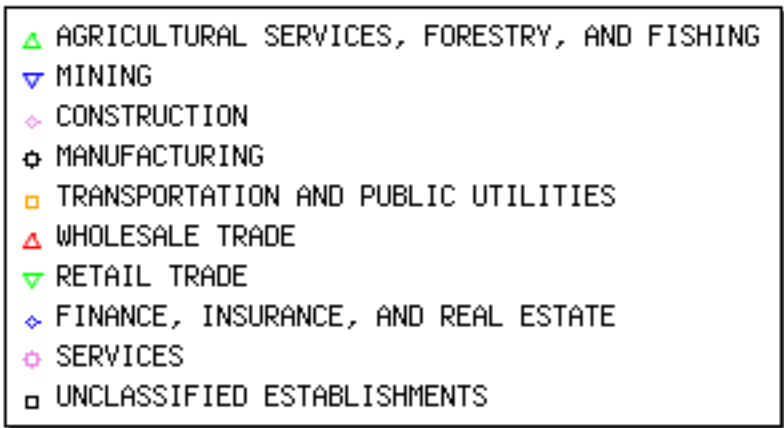
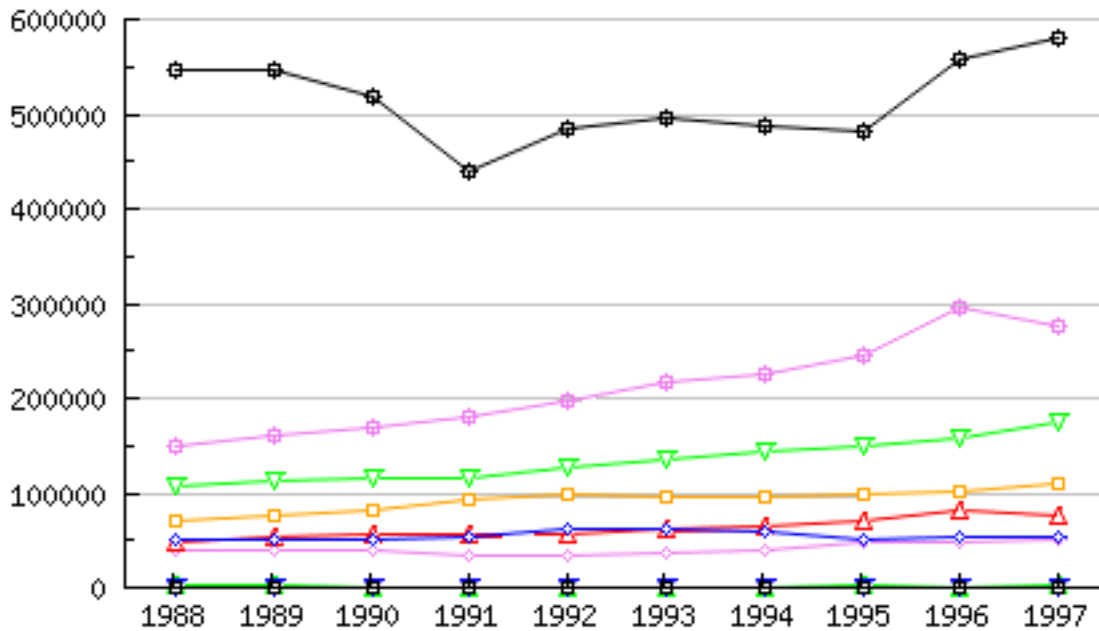

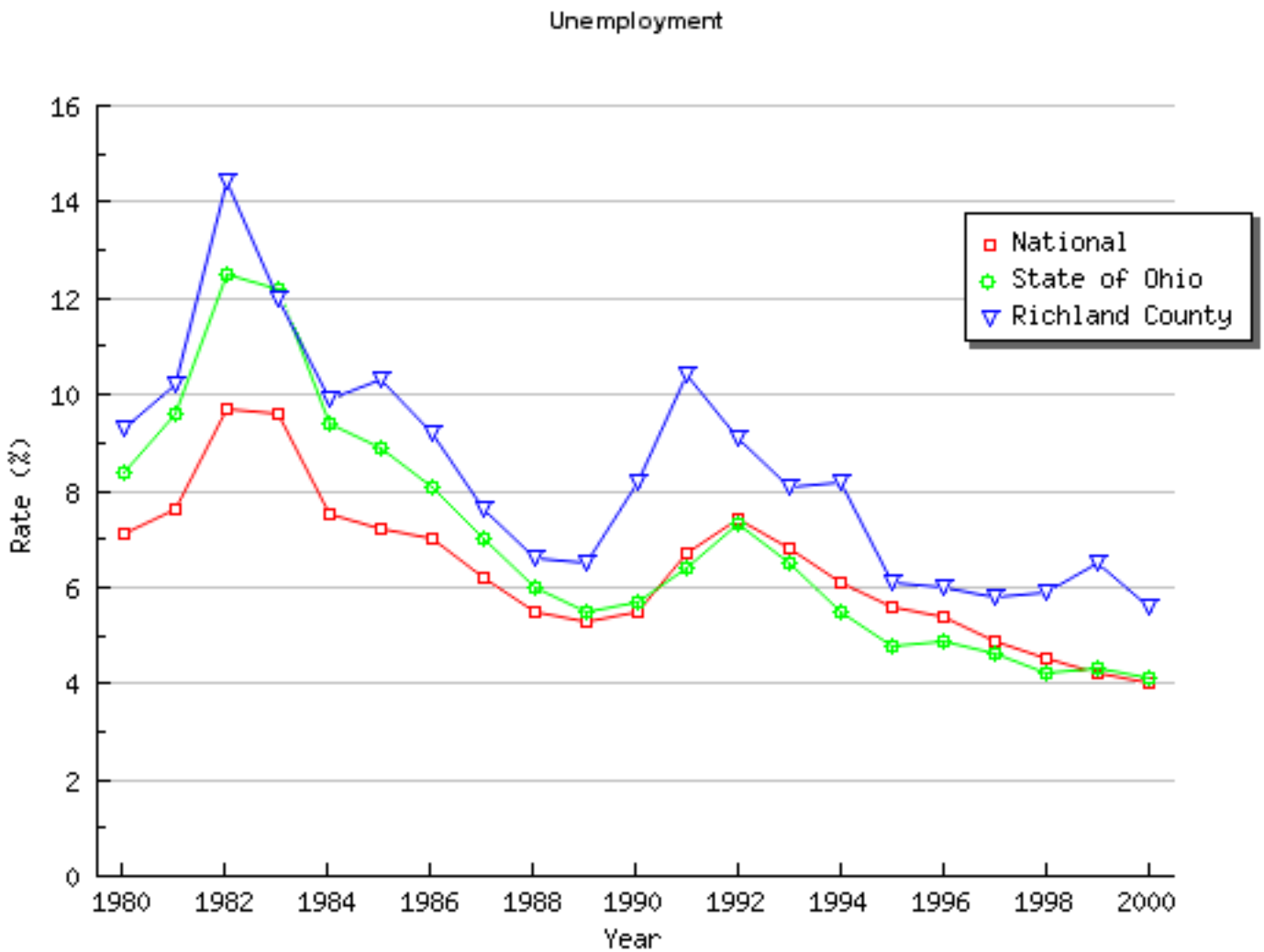

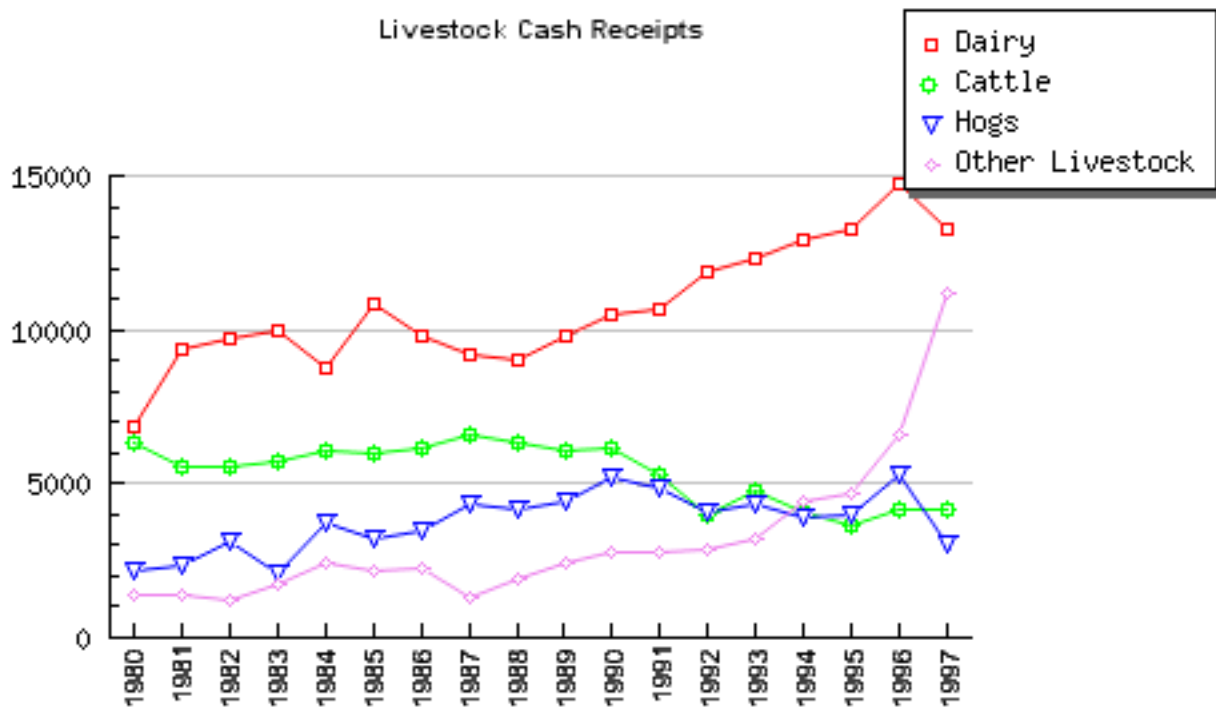

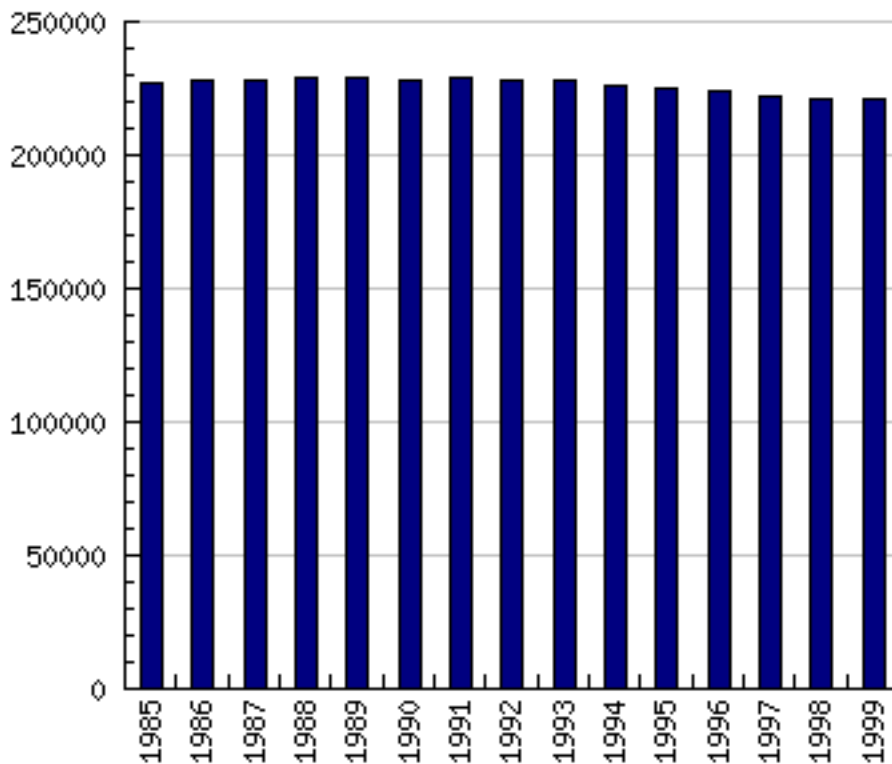
