- **B. Technical Advisory Committee Report**
 - Presentation of the 2017-18 Transportation Safety Study

Resolution 23-01 A resolution approving the 2017-2021 Transportation Safety Report

Pong Wu explained the study is a review of high-crash intersections to assist ODOT with safety targets and for inclusion into our MPO and TIP programs. Using ODOT's criteria in applying safety funds for projects, Regional Planning

will use the crash study to apply for funds focused on pedestrian safety or roadway departure crash prevention throughout Richland Co. Joe Gies asked for a motion to approve Resolutions 23-01

John Haholnycky made a motion to approve Resolution 23-01. Mayor Hutchinson seconded the motion and the motion was approved

 Resolution 23-02 A resolution amending the FY2021-2024 TIP (Transit Projects)

Todd explained this as a resolution to amend PID111766 RCTB FY2023 Transit projects, Bus Facility HVAC Systems using no local funds, project costs are: Transit Center \$52,000 and the Maintenance Garage \$348,000.

Resolution 23-03 A amending the FY2021-2024 TIP (US 42, SR 545 Culverts)
 Todd explained this as a resolution to amend PID-113284 combining the US 42 and SR 545 Culvert projects

Joe Gies asked for a motion to approve Resolutions 23-02 and 23-03

Chriss Harris made a motion to approve Resolutions 23-02 and 23-03. Deanna West-Torrence seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

C. Other Transportation Issues from the Floor and comments

- Todd was excited to announce that a group formed in Plymouth and applied for a Safe Routes to School grant and were awarded \$400,000. More funds are being sought and the grant will be used for sidewalks in the Pylmouth-Shiloh School District.
- County Engineer Adam Gove gave report that the new roundabout is getting close to opening. Paving and light issues have been set backs but the project is still on schedule. Adam is estimating about two weeks until the roundabout is put into service.
- Joe Gies reported that revitalization work is now going on in the downtown area

 Black Fork Commons. He also stated new school buildings are being put into
 service this school year and one last football game will be played in WW Skiles
 Field, after this game, football games will be in the new stadium.
- Bob Bianchi reported that property acquisition should start soon for the Main Street project. Mansfield applied for Raise Grant and are waiting to hear award news for that grant.
- Bellville Sidewalks Todd reported the new sidewalks in Bellville project is coming along in the planning stage well. The hope is to start moving forward by April 2023
- B&O Trail Resurfacing Todd reported discussions with ODOT to get this
 project moving are making progress.
- MPO COVID Funding Todd announced that some of this funding would be used for sidewalks in Ontario on Shelby-Ontario Rd on by the school to the corner on PAW. Sidewalks in Plymouth at the Mary Fate Park intersection are also planned for this funding.

3. Regional Planning Commission

A. ZLS Committee Report

 Jotika had one action item to report for ZLS. The ZLS Committee recommended that Parcel 026110314000 be rezoned from Industrial to Residential.
 Joe Gies asked for a motion to approve the ZLS Committee Report

John Jaholnycky made a motion to approve the ZLS Committee Report. Adam Gove seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

B. Executive Directors Report

- D16 Applications are due for 2024FY (Round 37) October 7th and the October 26th Full Commission meeting will be used for applicants presentations.
- FY22 has been closed. The FY22 was good financially. Jotika congratulated Terri Kiser on a clean audit without any findings for FY21.
- Dave is working on a Transportation Plan for Lexington, Jotika is hoping this will be the first of many Transportation Plans that Regional Planning will assist municipalities with.
- Pong Wu is transitioning into the Technical Directors position. Todd Blankenship will remain at Regional Planning for a good bit a time to assist the transition.
- The Housing Study is on track. Focus groups of homebuyers and renters are being set up.

C. Presidents Report -

 Joe Gies asked for a motion to formally accept the resignation of Dr. Norman Jones. Norman has accepted a promotion to move on to the OSU Columbus Campus.

Donnie Clark made a motion accept the resignation of Dr. Norman Jones. Adam Gove seconded the motion and the motion was approved.

- Barret Thomas made a presentation on the topic of the U.S. 30 Corridor Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy, otherwise known as CEDS
- Chriss Harris gave kudos to the Richland County area as having the best philanthropy donors. Chriss gave details on the planned Sterkel Park renovation, which will be the largest of its kind, 20 acres, ADA Park for all children, free of charge.
- Cristen Gilbert gave highlights of a 100,000sf indoor sports complex in the works. Plans will emphasize indoor and outdoor soccer fields, tracks and pickle ball. Cristen explained that details are limited now but plans, in detail, are forthcoming in the Fall.

Proposed Use: The Township would like to designate the land as Residential as they currently have residential homes on them.

The ZSL committee recommended that the request for a re-zone of 16 parcels from Industrial to Residential be approved with for the following reasons:

1. The 2035 Land Use Guidance Map and Richland County Comprehensive Plan recognizes this area as a urban area, with intermodal potential and with conflict from freeway interchange. This area is currently residential in nature and there is no prediction that it would be converted or move to an industrial use.

Recommendations:

1. The remainder of parcel 42312061501 should be included in the rezone to residential. Standard zoning practice would rezone the complete parcel and make the possible uses on the entire parcel cohesive. There is nothing that differentiates this parcel from the surrounding parcels that would lend it to be better used as industrial, when the rest of the area is found to be best used for residential. It should be noted that this is an 8+ acre parcel, 3.015 ac is only proposed to be rezoned per the maps submitted. This parcel was at one time 2 parcels but was combined once the current owner purchased the property. It is believed the Zoning Commission was not aware of this at the time the motion was made to rezone these parcels
