Dear Members of Transportation Advisory Committee and Coordinating Committee:

As we are approaching the end of the year, I would like to take the opportunity of this special joint meeting to extend my warmest gratitude and sincere appreciation for your continued support and trust over the years. Wish you a Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! May the upcoming year bring new goals and achievements on MPO/RCRPC Regional Transportation Improvement and Planning.

In our transportation planning efforts to save both TIP FY2023 funds and FY2022 OWP/CGP carryover funds from lapsing, after having closely worked with ODOT, the RCRPC/MPO calls to conduct a special joint meeting for the approval of three resolutions addressed below. As for the information portion, to save valuable funds from lapsing by the end of year, we also worked with ODOT for using the FY22 carryover funds under the approved FY2023 OWP tasks for W 4th St. corridor study.

Following are highlights of transportation projects and transportation planning actives prepared for reporting to the honorable and distinguished committee members:

Resolutions for Approval:

- Resolution 23-07 PID: 117965 RIC US 0042 04.15 (Lexington)
 - Main Street (US42) in Lexington roadway reconfiguration project to improve Bike, Pedestrian and vehicle traffic. This project was awarded \$500,000 in Safety Funds. We will use MPO funds to begin the design work, leaving the awarded safety funds to be used in the Construction Phase.
- Resolution 23-08 PID: 117565 RIC SR 0603 21.18 (Plymouth SRTS)
 - Installation of a sidewalk along SR 603 from Main Street in the village to the school campus property south of the village. This project was awarded \$400,000 in Safe Routes to School funding. We will use MPO funds to begin the design work, leaving the awarded safety fund to be used in the Construction Phase.
- Resolution 23-09 PID: 118245 RIC Millsboro Rd Trail (Mansfield)
 - Installation of a multi-use trail along Millsboro to connect the Marion Ave sidewalk to the Trimble Road sidewalk. Preliminary Design is almost complete and was paid for by the city. These funds will allow the City to contract for Real Estate Services and then purchase the needed Right of Way to complete the multi-use trail. Construction funds will also be requested of the MPO at a future date

1. Approval of the Minutes of July 12th, 2022 Meeting

Bob Bianchi asked for a motion to approve the Minutes of the July 12th, 2022 meeting.

Joe Gies made a motion to approve the Minutes, Adam Gove seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

2. Technical Advisory Committee Motions / Resolutions

A. Resolution 23-04: FY2022 OWP Completion Report

Todd spoke about the completion report and noted how the commission has not been fully staffed so that some of the carryover will be reduced once staffing levels are at 100%.

Joe Gies made a motion to approve Resolution 23-04, Adam Gove seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

B. Resolution 23-05: RFP/2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP)

Pong explained the Long Range Transportation Plan update and that a RFP will be put together to employ a consulting firm for the plan update. Bob asked if all jurisdictions were going to be consulted and Pong answered, yes, and that an advisory committee will be formed for this project. The question was asked if this process had been done before and Jotika stated that it has been done before but was done in house, not using a consultant. Pong added that for a planning practice, according to the future funds available, the regional-wide projects developed for 2050 LRTP will be divided into three time periods: Short-term: 2025 to 2030; Mid-term: 2031 to 2040; Long-term: 2041 to 2050.

Jodie Perry made a motion to approve Resolution 23-05, to put together a RFP for a long range transportation plan, Adam Gove seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

C. Motion to accept FY2022 Annual Listing of Federally Obligated Projects and Report for Website and Public Review

Pong explained that he needed a motion to approve the list of federally obligated projects list and to publish the list on the Regional Planning Commission's website. That this is a requirement of federal funds that the commission receives and is for obligated projects.

Jodie Perry made a motion to approve the Federally Funded Projects List and Publish for public review on the RCRPC website, Adam Gove seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

3 Projects Updates

A. RCRPC Federal-Aid Roadway System and Potential for Adding More Local Roads to the Federal-Aid System/Functional Classification System

Pong updated the TAC on the possibility to upgrade the region's roadways including major local roads to the federal-aid functional classification (FC) system or a higher level of FC system based on his discussions with ODOT staff and his recent study comparing ODOT/FHWA guidelines with reginal-wide total number of FC roadways (a result map was provided). Basically, ODOT will start to update the state-wide roadway Functional Classification system in the calendar year 2023 but it would take 1-2 years from calendar year 2023 to be completed. He said that it can be completed by the local entity (RCRPC) in a much shorter time frame, around 6 months. If any jurisdictions are interested they were asked to contact him.

B. TIP Project Update/Minor Changes

Todd provided updates on the B&O Bike Trail project, he is hoping to make a modification on the 3rd quarter STIP amendment. He further described some administrative modifications that needed done related to changes in PE on the Main Street project. He also discussed the Plymouth Sidewalk project and the need to consult with ODOT about it.

C. Other Potential Projects

He has also been investigating a pavement condition rating system and looking into consultants for a cost estimate and also trying to see what jurisdictions are interested in acquiring this data.

D. Public Transportation Report

Jean updated the TAC on the status of the TDP, the transit board has contracted with RLS &

Associates to perform the 10 year strategic plan. They will look at routes, employment centers, regional integration, and the possibility of funding for rural transit service. The goal is to get public input and analysis completed by March with a draft plan by summer. She asked that RCT be informed of any developments, and events for public outreach and also of any interest to be on the steering or oversight committees. She further related that the transit portion of the 4 year STIP plan was completed and to keep any partnerships to combine projects where a bus shelter could be placed in mind. An example was when a parking lot is renovated and a bus shelter could be added.

E. In-Kind

Pong explained that "in kind" dollars can be used as local match dollars and will keep the TAC informed when he has further details.

F. RCRPC/MPO Newsletter

Jotika let members know to send in any projects they have completed to have included in the newsletter put out by RCRPC.

G. Local Project updates

Todd went over local projects listing and explained that we need to get them plugged into a more definite timeline.

4 Other Business

Mike introduced Scott Ockunzzi, a new engineer in his office.

Joe Gies made a motion to adjourn the meeting; Adam Gove seconded the motion and all approved the motion.



West 4th Street Corridor Improvement Study (From Home Rd. to US 30 On/Off Ramp)

Purpose and Need


Every day about 22,000 commuters who live outside of RCRPC/MPO boundary travel to RCRPC region for their jobs (External – Internal), and meanwhile about 24,000 commuters who live within RCRPC/MPO boundary travel to communities outside of RCRPC/MPO boundary for jobs (In-Ex) in addition to the amount of daily 27,000 work-related trips that are generated and attracted internally within the RCRPC/MPO boundary(I-I); (See RCRPC OD Work Trip below).




The West 4th Street functioning as MPO's minor arterial in the urban area is one of through corridors that commuters travel for their work trips. The portion of West 4th Street to be conducted for traffic analysis from Home Road to Beer Road (2.1 mile) is a 4-lane roadway with signalized intersections at the major intersection, and from Beer Road to the US 30 EB On/Off Ramp (2.5 mile) is a 2-lane street with unsignalized TWSC intersections mostly along the corridor. (See Map 1 – Corridor Location & Intersection, Number of Lanes along Corridor).



The traffic condition and safety issues at various intersections along the corridor of West 4th Street between Home Rd and US 30 EB ON/Off-Ramp (4.6 miles) have raised concerns by community due to existing and planned various land use developments adjacent to this corridor (see Map 2/Land Use & Job Locations, Map 3/Planned Developments).





The Richland County Regional Planning Commission (MPO) is seeking to conduct a corridor study for the mentioned portion of West 4th Street that will address access management, transportation safety concerns, and land use strategies to better understand the future right-of way needs along the corridor within the Ontario Urban Area. Although there is no current project plan in the RCRPC current 2045 Plan, the consultant will analyze to identify projects that will improve operations and efficiency of the studied corridor based on be projected future development, population growth, forecasted traffic. The consultant is encouraged to work collaboratively with local officials and stakeholders (Such as the City of Ontario, RCRPC and ODOT) for existing and future adjacent land use development available. Recommending proposed concepts as necessary to accommodate existing and future transportation needs. Recommendations for identified concept from this corridor study will include the improvement plan for both street segments, intersections, and funding strategies.
