Roll Call

Joe Gies called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. and had all in attendance introduce themselves for Roll Call.

1. Approval of Minutes of the July 27, 2021 Meeting

2. Transportation Coordinating Committee

(Business of the Metropolitan Planning Organization MPO)

A. Public Transportation Report

- Jean Taddie, RCTB/Transit Development Manager drew attention to Fare Free Days, planned for November to support transportation to the polls and to recognize Veteran's service. In interest of time given to the Transportation Plan speaker, the rest of her updates were documented on a form attached to the packet.
- Jean introduced Christy Campoll to kick off the Transit Development Plan, a hired consultant from RLS. RLS is a 30 person-consulting firm with over 40 years of experience specializing in public transit. Christy the plan is to asses opportunities and needs of the Public Transit System and then prepare recommendations to include in the TDP.

B. Technical Advisory Committee Report

Todd Blankenship, Transportation Technical Director

- 1) **Resolution 23-04** – *A Resolution to Approve the FY22 OWP Completion Report*
 - Todd explained the OWP Completion Report encompasses all projects undertaken at Regional Planning including, CDBG, OPWC, The Housing Study, Lexington Comprehensive Study, RCT Transit, Mobility Programs, B&O Wayfinding Project, Lexington Active Transportation Plan.
- 2) **Resolution 22-06** – *A Resolution Amending the FY21-24 Transportation Improvement Plan*
 - Todd explained this resolution is needed to increase the Preliminary Engineering budget by about \$13,000
- 3) **Resolution 23-05** – *A Resolution for RFP Request for the 2050 Long-Range Plan*
Pong explained this is to provide permission for an RFP Request for recruiting consultants for the LRTP
- 4) *Pong explained the obligations for FY22 Annual listing of federally obligated projects and report as included with the meeting packet.*

**A RESOLUTION APPROVING
THE 2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan Request for Proposal (RFP)**

WHEREAS, the Coordinating Committee of the Continuing Comprehensive Land-Use and Transportation Program of the Richland County Regional Planning Commission who is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Mansfield urbanized area by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) in cooperation with locally elected officials of Richland County; and

WHEREAS, the Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) is a key tool in establishing MPO region's transportation improvement projects and maintaining regional transportation system; and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations require the LRTP to be a financially constrained transportation plan and the LRTP needs to be updated every five years;

WHEREAS, the last 2045 LRTP was adopted on June 24, 2020 and the creation of the new 2050 LRTP will take over about 18 months including 12 months in FY2024 (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024) and 6 months in FY2025 (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025);


